

THINGS WE NEED FROM YOU

1 - Detailed Survey and Space Plan


ROOM PLAN



To begin, a space plan of the room is prepared, with each wall labelled as North, South, East, or West based on its orientation. To ensure accurate labelling, the compass feature on your mobile app can be used for this. This systematic naming approach enhances clarity and facilitates better understanding of the project in subsequent phases.

The room's width and length are recorded on the plan in centimetres. Additionally, all recesses within the walls are individually measured and documented in the same manner. The locations and dimensions of doors and windows are also meticulously measured and noted on the plan.

NORTH WALL ELEVATION




2 - Wall Elevation Drawings

Then, detailed elevations of each wall are drawn up individually. These wall elevations are labelled in accordance with the orientation noted on space plan. The dimensions, including width and height, are then annotated on these drawings.

All other structural elements on the wall, such as columns, beams, recesses, windows and doors are also drawn on the elevations with width and height measurements in the same way.

NORTH WALL ELEVATION




Lastly, all fixtures, including light switches, electrical outlets, air conditioners, and heaters, are incorporated into the same elevation. Their heights, distances from the walls, and dimensions are carefully measured and documented.

There is no requirement to measure door and window sills or obtain detailed measurements of other fixtures, as the measurements gathered thus far will adequately capture the remaining details.

> All steps outlined in the second stage should be repeated for each wall view.

> All measurements must be rechecked to ensure accuracy and avoid any discrepancies.


NORTH WALL ELEVATION






GUIDELINES FOR MEASURING FURNITURE

1 - Measuring Freestanding Furniture



To accurately document the dimensions of the furniture you intend to keep, measure its width, length, and height. It is beneficial to provide the overall length between two points of the furniture from end to end. Then, measure the width and height from one edge to the other, and include these details alongside your sketches in your notes.




However, if the furniture's design includes notably varying widths, lengths, or heights, it is advisable to take multiple measurements at different points to highlight these differences.

It is not necessary to measure every intricate detail of the furniture.



If collating the measurements appears challenging, you may also capture photographs of the furniture from both the front, back and side views, annotating the images with the relevant dimensions.



2 - Measuring Fixed Furniture

If there are fixed pieces of furniture that you wish to retain or leave in their current positions, it is advisable to specify their width, length, and height, along with their precise location on the plan.

*All steps outlined in this stage should be repeated for every item you intend to retain.




