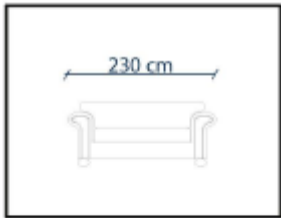


GUIDELINES FOR MEASURING FURNITURE

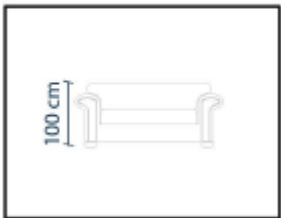
1 - Measuring Freestanding Furniture



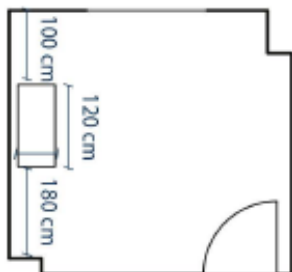
To accurately document the dimensions of the furniture you intend to keep, measure its width, length, and height. It is beneficial to provide the overall length between two points of the furniture from end to end. Then, measure the width and height from one edge to the other, and include these details alongside your sketches in your notes.



It is not necessary to measure every intricate detail of the furniture. However, if the furniture's design includes notably varying widths, lengths, or heights, it is advisable to take multiple measurements at different points to highlight these differences.



If collating the measurements appears challenging, you may also capture photographs of the furniture from both the front, back and side views, annotating the images with the relevant dimensions.



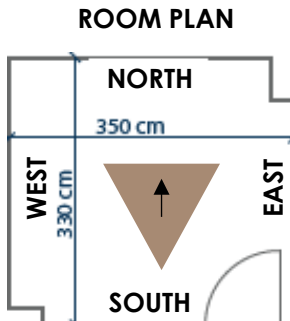
2 - Measuring Fixed Furniture

If there are fixed pieces of furniture that you wish to retain or leave in their current positions, it is advisable to specify their width, length, and height, along with their precise location on the plan.

*All steps outlined in this stage should be repeated for every item you intend to retain.

3 - Photographic Survey of Wall Elevations



All the walls annotated North, South, East and West are photographed from the opposite side.

You can use your phone's compass feature to find the directions.

4 - Existing Furniture and Decorations that will be kept

All furniture and accessories that are intended to continue to be used are photographed from different angle views.

The width, depth and height of all furniture and accessories that are intended to continue to be used are measured in centimetres annotated clearly on a photograph.
